Sub:- BIE., A.P., - ERTW-II (T.B) – Introduction of Environmental Education as a compulsory qualifying subject at Intermediate level – Certain instructions to conduct examinations – Reg.

All the Principals of Junior Colleges in the State are informed that the following instructions must be scrupulously followed in respect of Environmental Education.

1. Maximum Marks for Environmental Education Paper are 100. 60 Marks for Theory Examination and 40 marks for Project work.
2. The Principals should conduct the Theory Examination after the last day of the Pre-final Examination i.e., on 1-2-2007.
3. The Question Paper has to be prepared at the College level itself by selecting questions at random from each Unit, printed in the Text Book prepared by APNGC. However a format of question paper is enclosed for guidance.
4. Evaluation of the Answer Scripts should be done by the concerned Lecturers.
5. The Marks after Evaluation must be sent to the respective Regional Inspection Officers of the district in the prescribed Proforma enclosed for an onward transmission to B.I.E.
6. The qualifying marks for Theory & Project work put together must be 35 out of 100. However the student must appear for both Theory & Project work to qualify.

A copy of the Model Question paper is enclosed. The Principals are requested to give wide publicity about the pattern of Model Question Paper through the respective Junior Lecturers well in advance of the Examinations. They should also emphasize that there will be two questions each from every Unit and candidates are required to attempt one from each Unit.

PROJECT WORK

The number of projects listed in the Text Book Prepared by A.P.N.G.C. are 9. However the lecturers can conceive and frame quite a good number of Individual as well as Group Projects out of the material given from the pages 1 to 50 of Environmental Education Text Book prepared by APNGC.

There will be two types of Projects.

- 1) Individual Projects
- 2) Group Projects

The Individual Project work should be written by candidate in his / her own Hand Writing. It should consists of at least 15-20 sheets.

Group may consists of 5-10 students. The lecturers must take care that the student should not take up Group Project which has already been dealt by the student as an Individual Project. Each type of project carries 20 marks.

The Group Project should be prepared after thorough discussion among the group members. Participation of every student is a must. The Group project should be the essence of ideas of all the students. The group project may be divided into meaningful subdivisions and each subdivision may be allotted to 2 or 3 students.

The steps of the project:

The project work may be carried out based on the following out lines / steps.

1. Name of the Project:

3. Data Collection (Pictures, Photo Graphs, Samples, News papers cuttings, interview reports and any other):

Both the Group and Individual projects should be submitted to the Language lecturers and the Librarian immediately after Pongal Holidays. They are instructed to evaluate and award the marks and submit it to the concerned Principal.
